


The Ascension of Our Lord

The Feast of the Ascension of our Lord God and Savior Jesus Christ is celebrated each year on the fortieth day after the Great and Holy Feast of Pascha (Easter). Since the date of Pascha changes each year, the date of the Feast also changes. The Feast is always celebrated on a Thursday. The Feast itself commemorates when, on the fortieth day after His Resurrection, Jesus led His disciples to the Mount of Olives, and after blessing them and asking them to wait for the fulfillment of the promise of the Holy Spirit, He ascended into heaven.


Гешргій Поктадоновица Great Martyr George (May 6th)

Saint George was a wealthy and high ranking Cappadocian athlete of Christ. He was known for his military career, public confession of Christ, escaping a poison, and raising a dead man. Saint George was executed for refusing to make a sacrifice in honor of the pagan gods during the persecutions of the Emperor Diocletian in the early 4th century.




Преполовение Господне Mid Pentecost of our Lord (May 14)

Mid-Pentecost, also known as the Feast of the Holy Spirit, commemorates the event of Jesus teaching in the temple during the Feast of Tabernacles, symbolizing the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and the waters of grace.



Hoanna โรงเลง์หน John the Theologian (May 21)

This holy day commemorates how Saint John the Theologian (also known as John the Apostle) he was transferred to heaven, rather than dying. He is considered one of the three closest to Jesus Christ.



Перенесеніе Мощей Николы Transfer of Relics of St. Nicholas (May 22)

This day is remembered as the transfer of St. Nicholas's remains. The relics of Saint Nicholas were moved from Myra to Bari in 1087. After being displayed in Moscow and St. Petersburg, the relics were returned to Bari in late July 2017, where they remain today.


PRIMARY UPDATES
