One specific example of his generosity was when he saved three girls from being sold into slavery. There was a man that couldn't marry off his three daughters because he was too poor to pay for their dowries. A dowry is a payment made to a future spouse when one marries into their family, used in ancient times. The girls' father was planning to just sell his daughters away. Никола came from a wealthy family, and secretly donated money to the man for him to pay the marriage dowries, thus preventing the girls from being sold.
